AILEEN: LIFE AND DEATH OF A SERIAL KILLER

Nick Broomfield traces the tragic, farcical life of Aileen Wuornos, America's most renowned contemporary murderess, to its inevitable brutal conclusion.

Nick Broomfield first tackled the story of the world's first woman serial killer in his 1992 film *Aileen Wuornos, The Selling of A Serial Killer*. Aileen's lawyer, her born again Christian mother and the Florida state police had all been involved in trying to sell her story to the highest bidder. Aileen herself, who was convicted of murdering seven men, ironically emerged as the most honest person in the film.

Aileen and Nick kept in touch and then he was served with a subpoena to appear at Aileen's final state appeal before execution. Governor Bush branded Aileen as "evil", which was a convenient way of ignoring her appalling childhood and upbringing. Several layers of interrogation are at work in Broomfield's raw, compassionate follow-up film, and one is the lack of any societal support for Aileen. Another is Broomfield's frustration with the persistence of Florida officials to go ahead with Wuornos' execution in spite of her very apparent ravaged mental health.

But it is the way this film interrogates its predecessor, and Broomfield as a filmmaker, that gives it a unique place in the director's impressive and hugely influential filmography.

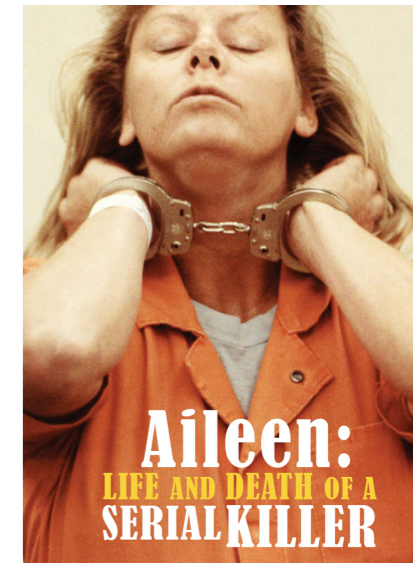

1992, Florida, USA. Aileen Wuornos is claimed to be the world's first female serial killer.

The three main characters are Aileen Wuornos, whom we see in prison, her born-again Christian mother, Eileen Pralee, who recently adopted Aileen Wuornos, and her lawyer, Steve Glazer. The film raises a number of questions about official corruption, not least of which is whether in fact she is a serial killer at all, or if that label is just a commercial means of selling Aileen Wuornos and her story.

FETISHES

Filmmaker Nick Broomfield spends eight weeks at Pandora's Box, a pricey bondage establishment located in New York City.

Fetishes reveals in both a humorous and informative manner the full range of fetishes, from rubber and infantilism, to asphyxiation and mummification.

Several fetishes take on a bizarre socio-political twist: Jewish clients into Nazi fantasies, black clients into plantation slave scenarios, a white policeman submitting to a black master. As one client remarked, "fetishes are the eroticisation of the worst thing you can ever imagine happening to you."

Clients pay upwards of \$10,000 a night to submit to a mistress who creates highly elaborate role-playing scenarios designed to meet her client's specific fetishist needs. Doctors and nurses, naked wrestling to bullwhipping, are played out in diverse theme rooms, like the Louis XV "Versailles Palace," to the Medical Room with operating table and surgical tools. Of course even a parlour as unusual as this one would not be complete without the customary medieval torture chamber with racks, cages and guillotines.

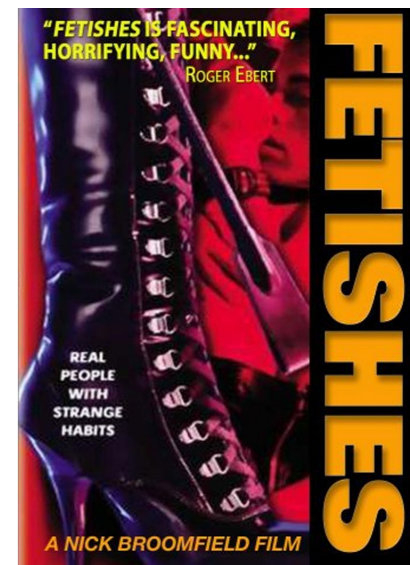

GOING GOING GONE: NICK BROOMFIELD'S DISSAPEARING BRITAIN

Two iconic British buildings are threatened with demolition and the intrepid Nick Broomfield is on the case.

Originally the social hub for the super-rich, Liverpool's Wellington Rooms, built in 1815 by Edmund Aikin, were a centrepiece for culture and community for two centuries. A Wedgwood ceiling and sprung dance floor, with classical columns, create a building of love and light.

And Cardiff's Coal Exchange, built in 1883 by Edward Seward, is a magnificent celebration of the coal industry's immense wealth. A glass-ceilinged exchange room with galleries on three floors and a unique lowered floor are a remarkable monument to this time.

With both buildings in a rundown state of faded glory, Nick Broomfield explores their diverse social history and meets those fighting to keep this precious architecture safe from the wrecking ball.

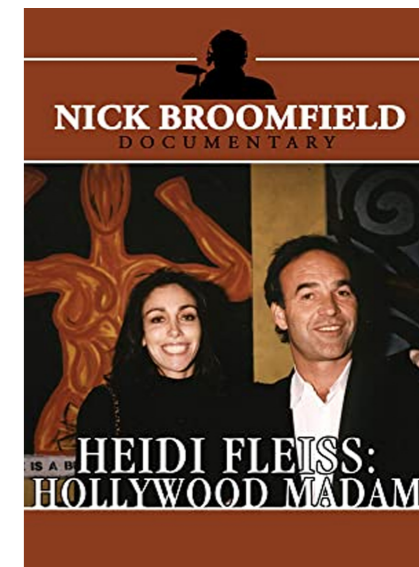

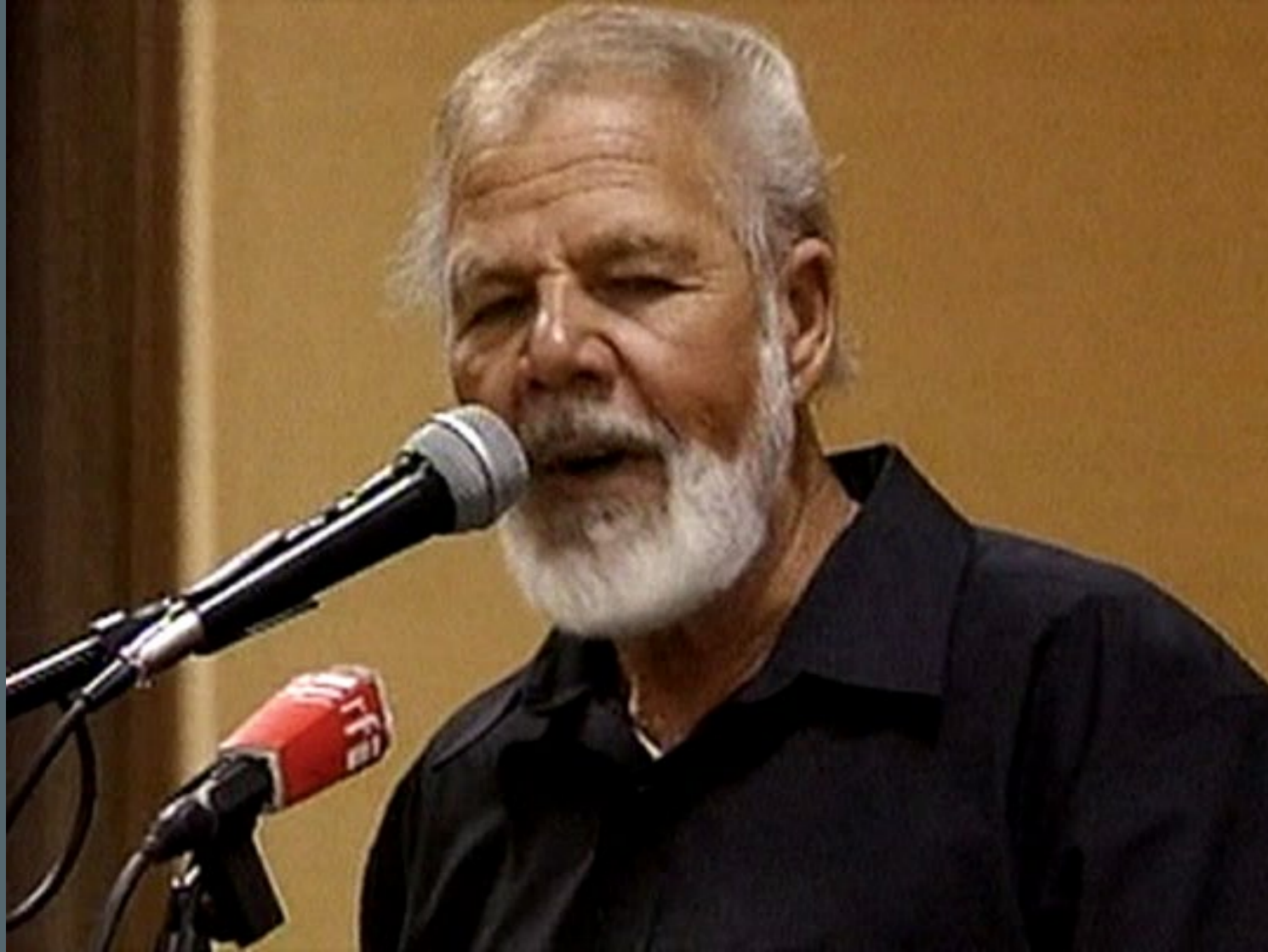

It also shows how the poorly trained police officers shown in the first film were made scapegoats, and bore the brunt of the criticism, as much victims as the children themselves. The banning of the original film caused the resignation of the entire British Film Institute Production Board, who put money into the film.

The first film Nick Broomfield made out of film school with Joan Churchill.

In 1968, juvenile liaison sections were attached to a number of local police departments to function as a kind of bridging operation between young offenders, their homes and their schools. This film is about the day to day working of one such section, attached to the Lancashire police in Blackburn in dealing with juvenile offenders.

The film, which led to a Public Enquiry into the scheme, examines the way poorly trained police interact with kids from poor underprivileged families. The results are devastating and deeply shocking.

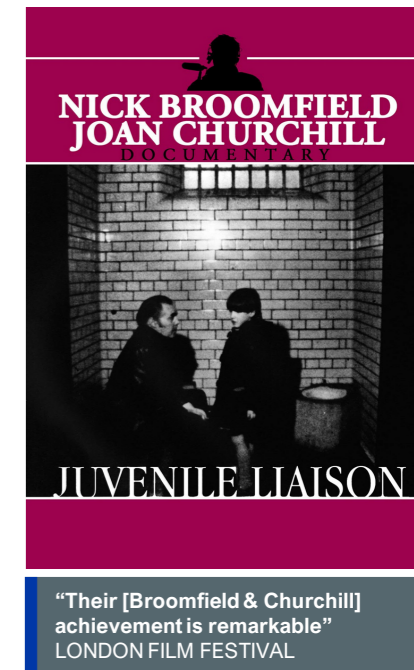

What began as an observation of Kurt Cobain, an investigation into his tragic death and his romance with Courtney Love took a different turn when Love intervened.

Cobain's death in 1994 shocked his fans tremendously. As lead singer and songwriter for the seminal rock band Nirvana he had touched the core of a generation with his music. Despite its official ruling as a suicide, there have been a number of allegations since, insinuating that more sinister forces were at work.

Broomfield's film begins with a poignant portrait of Cobain's early years and continues a voyage of discovery that brings Broomfield in touch with some of the strangest characters imaginable. Eventually when he decides to question Courtney Love about her possible involvement in Cobain's death the film becomes a startling commentary on modern celebrity and tabloid sensationalism.

Both a memoir and tribute, and in its intimate story of one family takes an expansive, philosophical look at the twentieth century itself.

For decades among the foremost names in documentary making, Nick Broomfield has often implicated himself in the filmmaking process with honesty and candor. Yet never has he made a movie more distinctly personal than this complex and moving film about his relationship with his humanist pacifist father, Maurice Broomfield.

In October 2020, the V&A Museum will celebrate the work of Maurice Broomfield, a factory worker turned photographer whose vivid, often lustrous images depicted industrial post-WWII England. Maurice's photography inspired Nick's own filmmaking career, yet also notably outlined a marked difference in their outlook, with Nick's less romantic, more left-wing political identity stemming from his Jewish mother.

SEX: MY BRITISH JOB

In a bold piece of undercover reporting, investigative journalist Hsiao-Hung Pai poses as a housekeeper to film secretly in brothels across London.

London is home to an estimated 2,000 brothels, and 80 percent of the prostitutes are foreigners, most of them illegal. This film was shot quite literally from the viewpoint of undercover reporter Hsiao Hung Pai, who worked illegally as a cleaner in a claustrophobic brothel for several weeks and used spy camera glasses to record the goings on there – while coming under increasing pressure to prostitute herself.

This intensely subjective approach means the film offers unusually personal insight into what drives undocumented Asian immigrants to become prostitutes, into the inhuman conditions in which they live, and especially into how inexperienced women are drawn into the world of the brothel. Comments such as "A blow job without a condom is normal" and "You will eventually lose your self-esteem" stand in stark contrast to the sugary-sweet Chinese feel-good music on the soundtrack.

The film consists predominantly of diary-like reports accompanied by Hsiao's voiceover, conversations with prostitutes and pimps in the brothel, and scenes of the women preparing to receive their clients, who appear and disappear in the stairwell. In intermezzos we see Hsiao handing over rushes to director Nick Broomfield, often seated in a car where they briefly discuss the state of affairs.

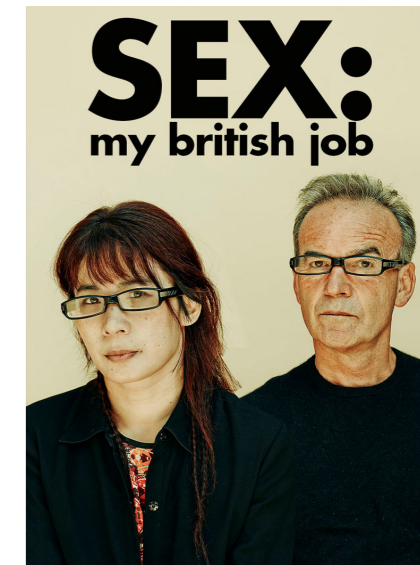

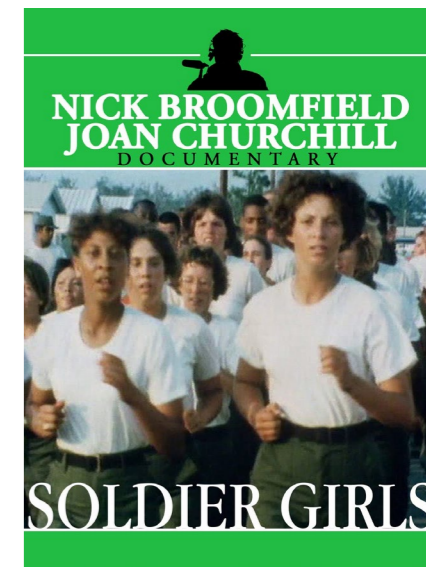

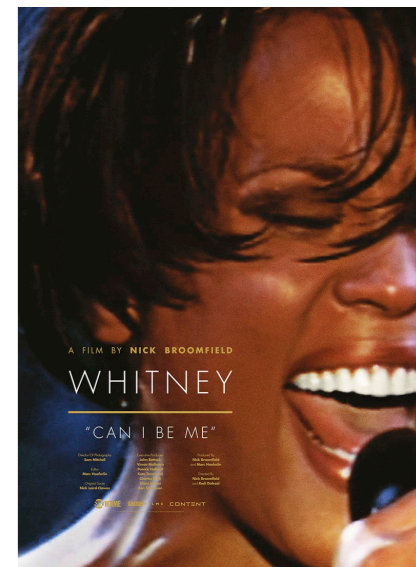

WHO CARES

Documentarian Nick Broomfield examines the problems of slum demolition and the removal of residents to new housing blocks.

As we hear them describe how the moves have affected them negatively, we see the old terraces being demolished, boarded up houses, and vans taking people's possessions to the new estates. The faceless 'Corporation' of Liverpool (the local authority) has deemed that they must move, and few get any choice where they move to.

Who Cares was made 'with the help of' Sir Arthur Elton, co-director (with Edgar Anstey) of *Housing Problems* (1935), which some 36 years earlier promoted the rehousing of working-class communities in large new estates.

Where *Housing Problems* identified urban terraces with dirt, poverty and unhappiness, Broomfield's Liverpudlians mourn the loss of community and closeness the terraces brought and find themselves unhappy and isolated in their brand-new homes.
